

# BioArtAttack (2D) 2025 competition to include the Nancy Rothwell Prize 2025

This competition is a drawing and painting competition for young people aged 7-18 years old to draw or paint your favourite animal, plant or fungi. The Nancy Rothwell Prize is a sub-category specifically for specimen drawings entered into this competition.

### BioArtAttack 2D (UK)

This competition is for 2D artworks (without labels or descriptions) featuring an endangered species; animal, plant or fungi. This is open to all young people aged 7 - 18 years old and currently living in the UK.

### **BioArtAttack 2D (Nancy Rothwell Prize 2025)**

This competition is open to all young people aged 7 - 18 years old from anywhere in the World, including the UK. To enter 2D drawings or paintings of any animal, plant or fungi into the Nancy Rothwell Prize 2025 category - these entries need to include labels and descriptions on the artwork itself.

### **Terms and Conditions**

Individual entrants are responsible for ensuring that they have read and abided by the terms and conditions before submitting their entries. No allowances will be made for instances where this is not the case. Any entry found not to comply with the competition rules is liable to be disqualified.

## **Eligibility**

- 1. The Organiser of the competition is the Royal Society of Biology, 1 Naoroji Street, London, WC1X 0GB. The competition is open to anyone except those involved in its organisation, employees of the Royal Society of Biology and their immediate family, sponsors of the competition, judges and their immediate family.
- 2. The competition is free to enter and is open to Royal Society of Biology members and non-members from around the world. Entrants must not be professional artists. For the purposes of this competition, a professional artist will be considered to be someone who makes more than half their annual income from the sale of their drawings.

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- 3. Entrants must be within the age range of the category at the time of the closing date (**3 July 2025**).
- 4. Entrants under 13 years of age must seek consent from a parent or guardian in order to take part in the competition. Details for the entrant's parent or guardian will be requested when they submit their drawing. The Royal Society of Biology will contact the parent or guardian to confirm details of consent are correct.
- 5. Prior to submission, entrants must not have offered any of their entries for sale, been paid for any publication of their entries, or won or been runner-up in any other drawing or art competition with any of their entries.
- 6. At the time of submission, entrants must declare to the Organiser whether they have entered their drawings in any other competition. Such submissions will be accepted for entry in to the RSB BioArtAttack (2D) competition and for the Nancy Rothwell Prize at the judges' discretion.
- 7. Individuals who have entered the RSB Nancy Rothwell Award in a previous year can enter again in 2025, however must declare in which year they had previously taken part and whether they had received an award. Previous winners of the RSB Nancy Rothwell Award cannot enter the competition again in the same age category.
- 8. The closing date for submissions is at 23:59 BST on **3 July 2025**. Any submissions received after this time will not be considered for the competition.

### **Drawing and file type specifications**

- 9. Images should be submitted as a high resolution JPEG file. Photographs and poor quality scans will not be accepted. Each entrant may only submit one image to the competition.
- 10. There are no restrictions on the type of 2D drawing, painting or specimen drawing that you create, but you must include information on the subject you are drawing, and if your observation is from a microscope, you must include the model and magnification.
- 11. Entrants should keep hold of their original drawings as these may be requested at a later date.



### **Subjects and Ethics**

- 12. The competition asks entrants to put the welfare of animals first and to safeguard their environment and that they do not do anything to injure or distress animals or destroy the environment in their attempt to get their drawings. If the Organiser or the judges suspect that a drawing was depicted using cruel or unethical practices, the entry will be disqualified.
- 13. It is the entrant's responsibility to be aware of and comply with the national or international legislation (e.g. in the case of protected species) governing the country in which their drawings are created.
- 14. All entrants will be asked to declare that the images they are submitting comply with the competition rules and that the information they provide is complete, true and accurate.
- 15. Entrants are requested to include details of the species in their drawings when submitting their entry.

### **Notification**

- 16. Winners and highly commended entries will be announced on the Royal Society of Biology's website in October 2025.
- 17. If the Organiser is unable to contact winners after reasonable attempts have been made, the Organiser reserves the right to offer the prize to a runner-up.

## Judging

- 18. Judges appointed by the Organiser will choose the winners. The Organiser's decision on all matters relating to the competition is final, and no correspondence will be entered into concerning the competition's judging and organisation.
- 19. Should the quality of entries fall below the standard required, the Organiser reserves the right not to award prizes. Such decisions shall be unchallengeable.

## **Copyright and Reproduction**

20. The copyright of the entire drawing or painting must belong to the entrant.

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- 21. Entrants will retain copyright in the drawings or paintings that they submit. By entering the competition, all entrants grant to the Royal Society of Biology the right to publish and exhibit their drawing or painting at Society events and to use the image(s) in any of our publicity, including, but not limited to, our magazine The Biologist, marketing materials, newsletters, posters, social media channels and on our website. Entries may also be retained and used for the Royal Society of Biology's media library. No fees will be payable for any of the above uses. Entrants whose drawings are one of the winning or highly-commended entries also agree to take part in post-competition publicity. While we make every effort to credit entrants, including in printed reproductions of their work, we cannot guarantee this. - 22. Media will be allowed to publish winning and shortlisted images free of charge for the purpose of promoting the competition without express permission from the entrant. All images used by the media will be credited to the artist.
- 23. Third parties will not be granted permission to use images for other purposes without express permission from the artist.

# Liability

24. All entries are sent at the entrant's risk. The Royal Society of Biology regrets that it cannot accept liability for any loss or damage of any images entered in the competition (howsoever caused) nor for any other loss or damage resulting there from.

### **Disclaimer**

25. The Royal Society of Biology reserves the right to cancel this competition or alter the rules at any stage, if deemed necessary in its opinion, and if circumstances arise outside of its control. Any breach of these terms by an entrant will void their entry. The Royal Society of Biology reserve the right to request the return of a prize if, at a later date, the entrant has been discovered to be in breach of these terms.
